

## 3 on 3 Tournament Rules

- **3 players** at a time from a team may play on the court when the ball is in play. Each team may consist of up to four registered players.
- Teams are provided with at least 5 minutes to warm up prior to the start of the game.
- At the **start of the game, a coin flip** shall assign the first ball holder.
- The ball should be cleared past the defined take back line and the game begins by "ball check"
   The offensive team passes the ball to a defender, who makes sure his team is ready to play before passing back to an offensive player and starting the game.
- One game lasts 15 minutes (running clock). Referee will report "7 minutes left" of a match and also "1 minute left."
- Baskets are scored as 1's. Referee will validate each point.
- The ball will change possession after each made basket and must be taken back to behind the defined take back line.
- Each team has 2 timeouts of max 30 sec, while the time is still running. You can take timeout anytime during the game while holding the ball with the exception of last minute of a game, when no timeout is allowed. Players may only sub during timeouts.
- After each change of possession, the ball must be passed in. The ball may not be shot at the start of possession without passing it in.
- In the case of a tie, 3 players from each team shoot a free throw (starting with "home" team). If the result is even, 1 player from each team has a free throw until the final score is made.
- In controversial situations, only the team representative speaks for the team.
- The game rules may not be changed by any player or referee. **The referee is the final call** in controversial situations.
- The referee has 1 timeout that they may issue for incidentals or if injury occurs where the clock will be stopped.
- The game referee calls the fouls during the game.
- When intentional and unjustified delaying occurs, the referee will issue a warning to the
  offending team. If delaying continues, referee may opt to turn the ball over the opposing team at
  the take back line.
- Abusive and overly aggressive behavior will not be tolerated and may result in player or team disqualification from the tournament.

All other rules are formally derived from the applicable rules of basketball. The tournament organizers have the veto right in case of controversial moments.
